The language teacher works closely with and is supported by the Hul'qu'mi'num Lead, resource coordinator and fluent elder.

*Prep time, professional development and training opportunities, are included in the school year calendar for all language teachers. SES school calendar includes, fall break (Nov 4-8, one week), winter break (Dec 13-Jan 3, two weeks), and spring break (Mar 17-28 two weeks)!*

The Hul'qu'mi'num' teacher works daily alongside our Educators, Families, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and community partners to engage students & their families in enhancing Hul'qu'mi'num' language into their daily lives.

- Collaborate with students, staff, and families in a respectful manner

- Participate in the development of Hul'qu'mi'num' language goals and education plans
